

## $B^2 + 1$ Cross



Each unit:

All rings used are 20 AWG

1 – 1/8" Center ring

16 – 1/8" Accent Color

15 – 1/8" Main Color

6 – 7/64" Accent Color

8 – 7/64" Main Color

4 – 5/32" Main Color

(For earrings add 2 – 1/8" for each unit to attach earwires)

(For pendant add 1 – 1/4" for bail or you can mobius two rings)

Step 1: Place eight (8) accent color 1/8" rings onto center ring and close it



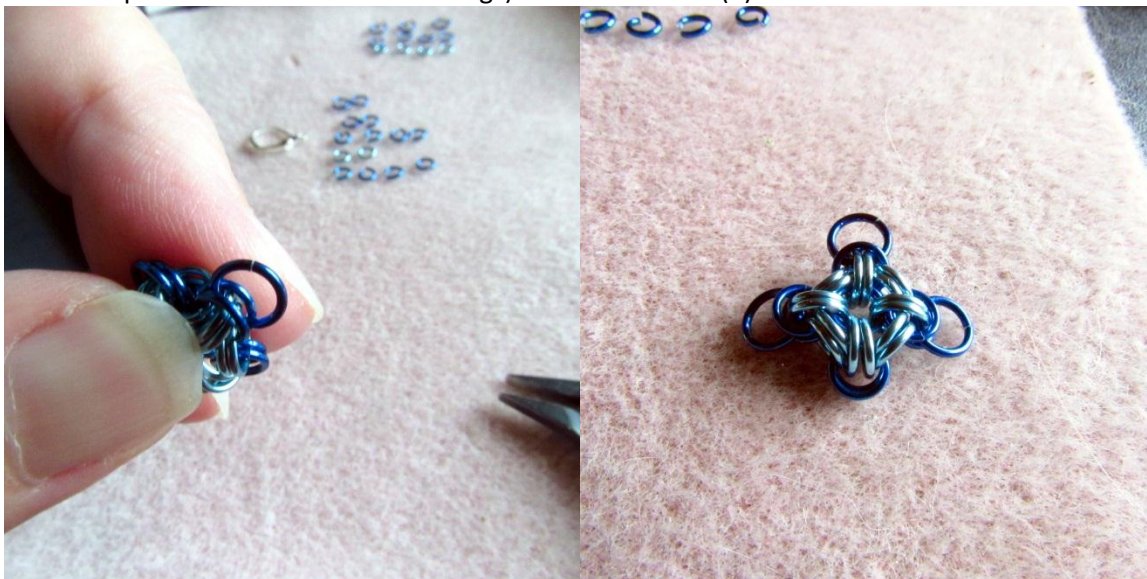
Step 2: Place two (2) main color 1/8" rings onto two accent rings as shown



Step 3: Connect each set of two (2) main color with two (2) accent color rings



Step 4: Wiggle and pinch the unit until it lays flat, then starting with the 5/32" rings, place it through the two center accent color rings as shown (it needs to go between the two main color rings to capture the two accent color rings) do this for three (3) corners



Step 5: Add one (1) 1/8" accent color ring to each of the three (3) corners you placed the 5/32" rings  
(This ring goes on top of the 5/32" rings)



Step 6: Repeat with the 7/64" rings (This ring goes on top of the 1/8" rings and will be a tight fit!!!)



Step 7: Now, working on the fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) corner place two 1/8" main color rings like you did the 5/32" corners



Step 8: Still working on the 4<sup>th</sup> corner. Using the 7/64" main color rings, add a 2x2 chain and flip back the last two rings (Byzantine style)

Step 9: Place two accent color 7/64" rings in the "eye" of the rings you folded back (Byzantine style)



Step 10: Add a main color 7/64" 2x2 chain to the two accent color rings and fold back the last two rings



Step 11: Add one 5/32" ring through the "eye" of the flipped rings



Step 12: Add one 1/8" accent color ring in on top of the 5/32" you just placed



Step 13: Add one 7/64" ring on top of the 1/8" ring you just placed



Congratulations you've made a cross!
